

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, April 9, 2019

Directors Present: George Strong, Vice President; Wayne Turk; Dennis Stafford; Hollis Gassen, President; Maria Skewis, Secretary

Staff Present: Jo E. Ball, General Mgr.; Donald Crawford, Field Mgr.; Clifford Howard, Plant Mgr.; Barbara Cowie, Office Mgr.;

Others Present: J. Edwards

Item 1 Call to Order: At 6:00 PM President, Hollis Gassen, declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

Item 2 Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence: The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. George Strong and cited by all present. Afterwards, a moment of silence was observed.

Item 3 Approve minutes of the March 12, 2019 General Meeting: A motion was made by George Strong and seconded by Wayne Turk to approve the March 12th meeting minutes as presented. Motion unanimously passed.

Item 4 Committee Reports: Audit & Finance: Dennis Stafford reported the Audit and Finance Committee had met earlier today and reviewed the District's invoices, check registers, investments, and bank statements for March and found everything to be in order.

Item 5 Public Comments: There were no public comments.

Item 6 Manager's Report: The manger's report was presented by Mr. Jody Ball and the following items were reported and/or discussed:

1) A Review of Trial Balance, Comparative Budget Report and Account Balance Summary List:

The Board reviewed the Trial Balance Report, Comparative Budget Report and the Account Balance Summary through March and found everything to be in order.

- 2) Review System Operational Reports:
- * District Water Losses. The District experienced a four-month average water loss through March of 14.2% and 6.7% loss for the month.
- * The District has 5151 active accounts through March. In March, 1 account was liquidated and 38 were shut-off for non-payment.
- * Total water sales for March was \$286,178.75
- * Average monthly water bill for March is \$59.82 and 2019 average is \$59.46. * Water pumped was 29.5M gallons and water sold was 11.8M gallons

with a loss difference of 17.7M gallons. There was 1 leak repaired.

- * There was 0 reportable accident/incident for the month.
- 3) Review current infrastructure projects: Engineers are continuing to review the District's 20 inch water line relocation at Highway 124 & 87 for possible solutions. The Governor's Office and GLO have approved the project to construct a one million gallon elevated water tank at the District's Crystal Beach plant. They have also approved a time extension for the construction of the tank. This project is being funded through grant monies.
- 4) Rollover Pass: There is no additional information available.
- 5) Personnel: One maintenance and one meter reader positions are open.

6) Finances: Net income for March is \$73,359.

Item 7 Consideration and possible action to accept 2018 Audit: J.R. Edwards & Associates, the District's outside auditor, presented their findings in an Annual Financial Report for 2018. A motion was made by Wayne Turk and seconded by Dennis Stafford to approve the Annual Financial Report for 2018 as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Item 8 Discussion and possible action on the Moody Bank Contract renewal for 2019: A motion was made by Dennis Stafford and seconded by George Strong to approve the renewal of the Moody Bank Contract with exception of yield %. The General Manager will contact Moody Bank to discuss the yield percentages for the CD's listed in their contract. Motion passed unanimously.

NURSE ON THE BEACH

Heart disease is still the No. 1 killer in America. Below are the **BEST** ways you can boost your heart health and reduce your risk of heart attack and stroke by loving your heart with every meal!

Don't let excuses like: I don't want to give up the foods I love; I'm busy, and cooking healthy meals takes too much time and effort; I don't know how to make healthy choices; or I need healthy food ideas the whole family will enjoy.

Four steps to a healthy heart:

- 1. More fruits and vegetables. Two cups of fruit and 2 ½ cups of vegetables per day. Leading the list: blueberries, cantaloupe, oranges, strawberries, sweet potatoes, asparagus, broccoli, red cabbage, spinach and bell peppers. (One serving size is equivalent to a tennis ball).
- 2. Dish out proper portions. This important step will prevent from overeating and gaining weight from excess calories. Sizes: 1 cup = tennis ball * $\frac{1}{2}$ cup = computer mouse * 1 ounce = 4 dice
- 3 ounces = a deck of cards for meat * 2 tablespoons = ping pong ball for sour cream, peanut butter, cream cheese.
 - 3. Healthier fats, Less sodium (salt)

Cut back on saturated and trans fats!!! NOW. These fats are lining your blood vessels with fats that turn into plaque. (Like the cement they chip off your teeth at the dentist's office). Yuk!

An example of the bad fats is: butter, lard, cream, shortening, bacon fat grease, fatty meat, deep fried foods. Replace these with healthier fats like polyunsaturated or monosaturated fats.

Cook with olive or canola oil instead of margarine or butter. Eat fish, like salmon and tuna twice a week. Add sliced avocado to your sandwich instead of cheese. Sprinkle nuts or flaxseed on your salad instead of bacon bits. Make this a goal and stick to it. Olive oil can be used in place of butter or margarine on toast or bread.

- 4. Check labels.
- * Calories per serving.
- * Fats: choose foods that get less than one-third of their calories from fat.
- * Sodium: Seventy percent of consumed salt comes from packaged foods, processed foods, and restaurant food. Pick products that have low salt/sodium content. Aim for 140mg or less. Lemon, vinegars, red or white wine can substitute for salt on your food.
- * Fiber: Get at least 25-38 grams per day. Your colon will thank ou.
- * Sugars: Watch for high amounts of added sugar, fructose, corn syrup, sucrose or glucose they are all sugar. Many juices contain as high as 38mgs of sugar! This is way too much.

Don't forget to walk whenever possible on that beautiful beach! Spring is here and much more sun! Walk in the morning or evening and stay hydrated. Sun block use (liberally) apply every 2 hours when outside.

5 East Steps to Follow

- 1. Know where to go in the event of an evacuation. Check evacuation routes with your county's EOCs.
- **2.** Have a go-bag prepared with the important documents and necessary supplies.

(Three-day supply of non-perishable food and water—one gallon per person, per day for drinking and hygiene purposes; Battery-powered or hand crank radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible); Flashlight and extra batteries; First aid kit, medications and medical items; Copies of all important documents (proof of address, deed/lease to home, passports, birth certificates, insurance policies); Extra cash)

- **3.** Should you stay at home, have adequate provisions on hand. Plan to be without power for at least a week.
- **4.** Have an emergency communications plan set up with family members.
- 5. Sign up for community-wide alerts.

OLD-FASHIONED JULY 4 PICNIC RECIPES

Who doesn't enjoy a picnic? Here are some old-fashioned recipes for an old-fashioned picnic.

Enjoy and have a safe July 4!

FOURTH OF JULY HOT DOG FIRE STICKS

1 can refrigerated breadstick dough2 packages hot dogs (16)16 thick slices Colby cheese16 skewers

First take your skewers and stick them all the way through your hot dogs leaving about an inch and a half exposed out of the top of each hot dog. Then take a piece of breadstick dough and carefully wrap it around the hot dog until you get to the top. Place the wrapped dogs on a Silpat (non-stick baking liner) or parchment paper and bake according to the package directions for the breadstick dough. It took us about 20



minutes at 350 degrees. While the hot dogs are cooking take out your cheese slices. Then using a small star cookie cutter, cut out your stars. Depending on how big or small your cookie cutter is will determine how many stars you get out of each slice of cheese. After your dogs have cooled for 2-3 minutes stick the star through the skewer at the top.

Use a pail with a styrofoam ball hidden by crinkly papers to display them. This would also be a great way to display them at a gathering. You can also just layer them on top of each other on a plate.

CUBAN SLIDERS FOR A CROWD

4 tablespoons unsalted butter, at room temperature, divided

15 slider buns, halved

11/2 tablespoons mustard

15 slices ham (your choice)

15 dill pickle chips

7 slices Swiss cheese

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease a 9-by-13-inch pan with 2 tablespoons of the butter. Open the halved buns and spread the mustard evenly on the inside of the top and bottom halves. Place the bottom halves snugly into the base of the prepared pan.



Place a slice of ham on each bottom half and then top with a pickle chip. Arrange the cheese evenly over all the buns in the pan.

Place the top halves of the buns on each sandwich and use your hands to butter the surface of the buns with the remaining 2 tablespoons butter. Tent the pan with foil and bake until the sliders are heated through, 10 to 12 minutes. Serve warm. Serves 15.

CLASSIC POTATO SALAD

8 medium Yukon gold potatoes, cooked, peeled and diced

1- 1/2 cups mayonnaise

2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar

1 tablespoon granulated sugar

1 tablespoon yellow mustard

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon celery seed

1/2 teaspoon pepper

2 celery ribs, diced


1/4 cup onion, diced

5 hard-boiled eggs diced or sliced

Boil potatoes in salted water 15 to 20 minutes or until done. Cool to room temperature and peel.

Dice the boiled potatoes and put into a bowl.

In another bowl mix together mayonnaise, apple cider vinegar, sugar, mustard, salt, celery seed, and pepper until well



Stir in the eggs.

Sprinkle with paprika (optional).

Cover and refrigerate until chilled. Stir before serving, and enjoy!

BEST POTATO SALAD TIPS

I always choose Yukon Gold potatoes when making my mom's classic potato salad recipe. These are nice and creamy but they don't fall apart when you cook the potatoes. The peels also come off easily after cooking which makes everything so much easier!

SMALL FRIED APPLE PIES

2 Pillsbury pie crusts – or make your own 2 apples

2 apples

1/4 Cup Sugar (optional)

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon (optional)

Cinnamon and sugar were ingredients that were more expensive in the past and were hard to come by during the depression so they were probably not a part of this recipe then. First, peel the apples and chop them up.

Put them in a pot and cook them down on very low heat and mash.

Roll out the pie crust on a lightly floured board. Using a 3 inch cookie cutter, cut out about 7 circles.

Place a scant teaspoon of the cooked apples in the middle of the round.

Using very cold water and your fingers,

wet all the way around edges of the pie dough circle, fold it over and crimp edges with the fork and make a slit in the top.

Put a little oil in a skillet and let it get hot first, then place the little pies in the skillet and cook for 2-3 minutes on each side.

Take them out of the oil when they are cooked and place on a wire rack with paper towels on them to take off the excess oil.

ICING FOR FRIED PIES

1 teaspoon softened butter

1 cup powdered sugar

½ teaspoon vanilla

1-3 tablespoons milk

Whip that up with a fork and then put the glaze over the warm pies.

OLD-FASHIONED LEMONADE

1- 1/2 c. sugar

1- 1/2 c. fresh lemon juice (from about 10 lemons), plus 2 lemons, sliced

Berries and fresh mint sprigs, for garnish

In a small saucepan, combine sugar and 1- 1/2 cups water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until the sugar dissolves, 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from heat and cool completely.

In a large pitcher, combine lemon juice, 1-1/2 cups sugar syrup, and 4 cups cold water (Add remaining sugar syrup to adjust sweetness, if desired). Refrigerate until chilled.

Makes 7 cups



Deadlines & County Tax Office News

payment installment is due July 1st. Split payment coupons were mailed May 15th so be on the lookout.

Those having difficulty paying 2018 property taxes or who have missed an installment payment will receive a delinquent notice before the end of the month. Tax Assessor/Collector Cheryl E. Johnson urges property owners to pay the delinquent taxes by July 1st in order to avoid delinquent attorney fee that will be added July 2nd.

Unpaid taxes accrue interest at a rate of 1% per month beginning in February. Penalties are assessed at 6% the first month and increase 1% each month until July at which time they jump to 12% of the unpaid balance. "What this means is that penalties and interest total 18% July 2nd. Add to that the 15% to 20% delinquent attorney fee and a property owner will owe the base tax plus a total of from 33% to 38% in penalties, interest and attorney fees," stated Johnson.

Those unable to pay their entire tax bill should contact the Property Tax Department (409-766-2481) or toll free (877-766-2284) or come to the Galveston Office at 722 Moody between 8 am and 5 pm Monday through Friday in order to make arrangements to pay. "Please avoid

The second half of the split or half the unnecessary additional cost of the 15% to 20% attorney fee," urged Johnson. "We want to work with our property owners and get these taxes taken care of as soon as possible in order to reduce the burden of unnecessary additional costs.'

Cash, checks, credit and debit cards are accepted at any of the four full time Tax Office locations in Galveston, League City, Santa Fe, or Texas City or at the Friendswood satellite office each Thursday and Friday or Crystal Beach the 3rd Tuesday of each month. RECENT HAPPENINGS IN THE LEGISLATURE Mayes Middleton, State Representative

TWIA Rate Freeze Legislation Passes House

Many property owners in House District 23 and all along the Gulf Coast are insured by the Texas Windstorm Insurance Association. As TWIA policyholders, they are subject to ever-increasing rate hikes year-after-year with no choice but to pay them. This expense has outpaced inflation and has exceeded property taxes and mortgage payments for many coastal residents. Always a heavy burden, these rate hikes are downright cruel in the wake of the devastation wrought by Hurricane Harvey. I am proud to be a joint author on House Bill 4534, which passed the House on Friday of last week and will give coastal homeowners some relief. The bill includes a 2-year premium rate freeze for TWIA policyholders and establishes a review board that will assess and make recommendations on TWIA's future funding structure with a view to protect ratepayers. I am hopeful that this legislation will become law so that our Gulf Coast can finally have relief from the growing burden of TWIA premium hikes.

Property Tax Homestead Exemption laid out in committee

Last Thursday, I laid out House Bill 3127 in the House Ways and Means Committee. This bill, brought to me by the City of Mont Belvieu in Chambers County, would allow local jurisdictions the option to grant a 100% homestead exemption against the valuation of residence homesteads for the jurisdiction. Reforms like this would empower local governments to provide a meaningful reduction in property taxes for their residents at their discretion.

Ban on Red Light Cameras Passes House

Yesterday, House Bill 1631--banning the use of Red Light Cameras--passed the Texas House. I was proud to be a co-author and stand in support of this important bill to protect Texans' constitutional right to face their accuser in court and with due process. The bill now moves to the Senate, where I am hopeful it will soon pass into law.




It was an honor to just stand and watch as these guys, and a few ladies, march, chanting cadence. Their flag decorated Jeeps followed.

Wolf Spiders

If you change the angle of the light that enters your eyes on a lateevening beach walk, you can often catch a glimpse of one of the fiercest of the grassroot predators. Hold your flashlight along the side of your head as you walk above the strand line, watching for greenish or bluish sparkles in or along the edge of the dune vegetation. There—a tiny flash! Follow the shine to its source, and you will have probably found a wolf spider (Lycosa, Pardosa, or Pirata spp.) on the hunt. While most of these spiders will only be a centimeter or so long, an occasional big one that spans 40 mm or so will turn up. These can make excellent temporary pets, about which I'll have more to say later.

Although there are many different species of wolf spiders, the group has a remarkable similarity of appearance. Almost all of them are velvety gray or brown with stripes on the abdomen and legs. The bristles on these legs are sensitive to nearby movement and greatly aid the spiders in catching prey. Setting wolf spiders apart from most other spiders are the size and positioning of their eight eyes: a row of four smaller forward- and sidewayspointing eyes, two huge forwardpointing eyes, and a final pair of eyes pointing upward and slightly backward. This arrangement gives wolf spiders an impressive four-directional vision. At the back of the eyes of nocturnal wolf spiders is a reflective layer or tapetum. This enhances their night vision, but it is what betrays them to our flashlights when we spot them on the hunt.

Wolf spiders do not spin webs like the familiar garden spider. Instead, they may have lifestyles that range from an almost complete independence from silk to living in a silk-lined burrow or tunnel from which sorties against prey may be launched. Females of our largest species, Lycosa carolinensis, frequently build a "turret" at the top of their burrows from which to spy on and attack passing insects.

Life for a wolf spider begins when it hatches from a fertilized egg along with many siblings. These hatch in a nearly helpless, almost embryonic state, safely

enclosed within a silk "cocoon" or egg sac that the mother drags along after her like a purse. After a week or so, the young spiderlings go through a molt or shed and become capable of independent movement. At this time, the mother spider opens her egg sac and helps the babies to crawl onto her abdomen and cephalothorax. The spiderlings form a living blanket on top of their mother and are tolerated by her anywhere except her eyes. The spiderlings do not feed during this "piggyback" stage, but have been observed taking water from dewdrops.

Eventually, the baby wolf spiders mature to the point of independence and leave their mother. They

scamper and clamber to the tops of any nearby grass blades and twigs and rapidly spin out a line of thin silk, or gossamer, which may be many times longer than the spider. Caught by the faintest breeze, these silk thread "balloons" whisk the spiderlings off to new territories that can be hundreds of miles away from their hatching sites. Naturalists have collected baby spiders on ship's rigging far out at sea, explaining why spiders are often the first colonists of new volcanic islands.

Upon landing, the spiderlings set about feeding and growing. Wolf spiders are fairly long-lived as spiders go and may survive several years, with the females far outliving the males as in most spiders.

Should you find a wolf spider in your bathtub or under a stone, consider keeping it for a temporary pet. Do not try to pick up a wolf spider with your fingers, as they can deliver a painful bite (and you will probably injure the spider). Scoop it up in a small jar or container like a cigarette box instead. Males can be told from females by their smaller size and the oddly-shaped swollen palps (often wrongly called "feelers") alongside their heads. Males will not live as long as females and often do not feed after they have reached maturity, so you may wish to continue your search for a female. If you catch a wolf spider carrying an egg sac, it is surely a female. A small plastic

"habitat" cage or a fishbowl makes an ideal vivarium. Outfit the container with a bed of light sandy soil and a few twigs and hiding places and your spider will be quite at home. To feed it, remove one wing from a freshly-caught live fly or moth and drop it near the spider—WHAM! An occasional misting with a small amount of water will

provide your spider with water. If it is a large one, use a pencil to make a burrow for it and your spider may move in and make "improvements" such as a reinforced silk-and-fiber "door". From there, it may perch with just its eyes visible, looking out over its tiny domain like a fairy-tale ogre.

Should you tire of your spider or not wish to play host to 30 or more babies, simply turn it out in your backyard. It will quickly revert to the wild creature that, in fact, it always was.
